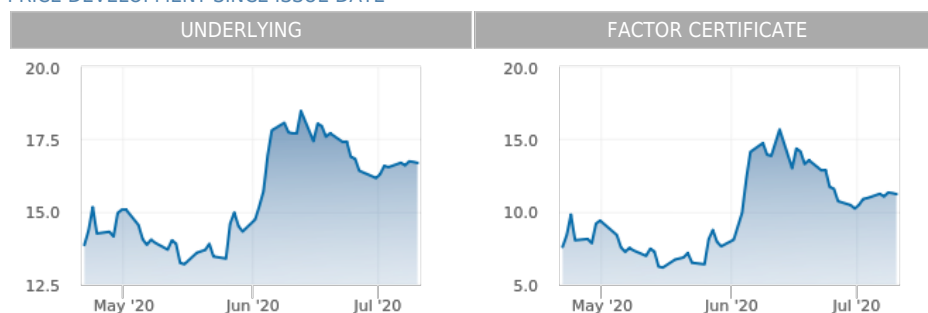
DESCRIPTION

Factor Certificates enable investors to participate with a leverage effect in the performance of the underlying. The certificates have a constant leverage factor, no knock-out and are open-ended. Long Factor Certificates provide investors with above average profit opportunities in rising markets.

**Please note:** The **leverage effect** of a factor certificate means that fluctuations in the value of the underlying have a disproportionate impact on the value of the factor certificate. Even small, unfavorable developments in the underlying can lead to the loss of a substantial part of the capital invested, up to a **total loss**. Therefore, the probability of a total loss occurring is greatly increased. If the underlying of the factor certificate is a future (e.g. commodity), the **issue of rolling** must be taken into account.
